

Hydration an article submitted by John McConnel

Like a racecar needs fuel and lubricants to keep it running at an optimal pace, the body is also in need of certain things in order for it to function properly. Hydration happens on many levels. Most think that it only happens by drinking water but that's just one way to hydrate. Everything you drink adds to you total liquid intake whether it is coffee, juice, soda, or water. You can also add to hydration by eating foods as well. Some foods, such as oranges, contain up to 90% water in them. Salads, vegetables, and fruits contain lots of water.

So what is all this hydration and drinking fluids talk about? We spend our Sunday afternoons racing cars around huge parking lots. We actually only spend a few minutes behind the wheel. The rest of the time we are walking, talking, chasing cones, looking at cars, and enjoying the 90+ degree heat that we are usually blessed with. The temperature that shows up on your iPhone does not reflect the heat rising off of the blacktop. We are all athletes whether we believe it or not. We spend our Sundays in the hot sun doing the things we love to do. In order for us to perform at our peak we need to make sure we are getting plenty of fluids.

I remember last season one of our spectators ended up with a mild heat stroke because she was not hydrated enough. It was one of the hotter days that we have had and we were all baking. She was taken over to one of the tents and given some water. We created a make shift cooling device by wrapping lots of ice in a t-shirt and putting it around the back of her neck. This cooled the main arteries in her neck, which brought her body temperature back down to a normal temp. She was ok but it could have been worse.

What do you need to remember? Drink water. Our

sponsors bring coolers to the events so that we can partake in some delicious H2O for free. You can bring your own cooler. You can also bring a refillable water bottle of your own to carry around. I usually bring a gallon of water and keep it in a cool place so I can refill when I need. You want to make sure you are taking a Pit stop at least every 2 hours (maybe sooner). You should have clear urine. If it is dark and not as frequent as every 2 hours then you need to be drinking more. Electrolytes are good but too many are not good. A good mix is 2 to 1. 2 cups of water to every cup of whatever else your drinking.

One last note, if you are enjoying some adult drinks the night before try to grab a glass of water before you hit the sack. This will help with your hydration the next day. Race hard, play hard, and don't forget to drink plenty of fluids in between.
