

It's March 15th and you're pulling up to the starting line at NCM for your final run in the first KYSCCA Autocross of the season. You're thinking about how you need to get in tighter on the apex cone in turn four and take the slalom a little bit faster. You've played the perfect run out in your head a dozen times, and you know you're going to make it happen. Then you think to yourself, "I wonder all of those expenses from moving to Bowling Green to be closer to the track... I mean my new job, are tax deductible?" Next thing you know, you've completely ruined your last run and get to go home without a trophy.

Nobody wants to worry about their taxes at all, much less when they're trying to focus on the important things in life like motorsports or spending time with family. This is why it may be a good idea to call a professional as your tax situation grows more complicated. 2015 Solo Changes by Tech Chief Tony Morrow:

The start to the autocross season is just around the corner. The SCCA made some large changes for 2015 so its time to pull out the rule book and make sure all those mods you made during the winter haven't bumped you out of a desired class. Here are a few rule changes that I think everyone should be aware of.

- All the Street-R classes (except SSR) are gone. They were only meant to be around for one year so competitors could finish using up their race compound tires. Super Street will keep an "R" class because the SCCA recognizes these vehicles either have limited options when it comes to competitive street tires or need the extra grip due to their high horsepower.
- "Street" tire minimum tread wear is now 200 UTQG. The SCCA said this was coming way back in 2013 with the announcement of the new "Street" rules. In 2014 competitors could keep running 140 UTQG tires, use them up, and by 200 UTQG. For 2015 you must be running 200 UTQG tread wear tires to be eligible for any Street, Street Touring, or Street Prepared class. Anything lower and you automatically get bumped to a Street Modified class.
- Street Touring Compact (STC) has been combined into Street Tire Sport (STS). Three years after the split of Street Touring (ST) into Street Touring FWD (STF) and Street Touring Compact (STC) the SCCA has decided to eliminate STC and combine it with STS.
- **G Prepared has been eliminated and cars have been distributed between DP & EP.** The SCCA simply said the class was no longer filling its original goal.
- Classic American Muscle (CAM) has new rules. For 2015, C4 and newer Corvettes as well as Vipers are explicitly excluded from CAM classes. The class has also been broken up into three sub classes with CAM-T (Traditional) for vehicles manufactured from 1954 to 1972, CAM-C (Contemporary) for vehicles from 1973 to today, and CAM-S (Sports) for lightweight, two seater cars.
- **Street Tire Open will require 200 UTQG tires.** This was decided at January's board meeting. Rules for STO have been updated and posted on the KYSCCA website. Here are the specifics.
 - The vehicle must meet the eligibility requirements outlined in section 3.1 of the SCCA® National Solo® Rule Book.
 - The vehicle must meet the safety requirements outlined section 3.3 of the SCCA® National Solo® Rule Book.
 - The vehicle must have tires that meet the rules outlined in section 13.3 of the SCCA® National Solo® Rule Book.

The vehicle cannot be an "open wheeled" car. IT MUST HAVE FENDERS.

I am happy to inform you that we are taking the first steps in the next level of motorsport activities with the SCCA. It all started with Solo where you gained valuable experience and knowledge about high performance driving. Now you can take that and apply it to road courses. So, how do we get you there?

4 Event Levels:

Performance Driving Experience, PDX, Club Trials, Track Trials, Club Racing

- -PDX provides an instructional environment for drivers who simply want to improve their driving skills and increase their enjoyment of driving their street vehicle. We provide class and hands on instruction one-on-one with a qualified instructor.
- -Club Trials adds advanced driving techniques, competition rules and timing elements. There will be a higher driver to instructor ratio. Instructors will critique and be a valuable resource for drivers as they develop their skills throughout the day.
- -Track Trials is where unprepared cars get sidelined and the course gets faster. Car classes are put together and you are in the chase of the fastest time. This is not wheel-to-wheel racing and you are restricted to fewer laps in contrast to the previous levels. Solo type of competition on the road course!
- -Finally you enter into Club Racing. This is full blown wheel-to-wheel racing.

First Steps:

- -We are currently gathering information, putting together a track committee and getting a game plan together to host these types of events.
- -This is where you can get involved today. To put on these events we need qualified and licensed Chiefs in specialty positions. This will take time and a sincere commitment by volunteers. We will be receiving help from other regions to help train and enable us to participate in their events as Chief Apprentices. They will also augment our region on staffing future events.
- -So if you are interested in Flagging/Communications, Safety, Inspections, Grid and Start control, these are specialties you can get licensed for. This will involve traveling to events and spending entire weekends of volunteering at track events. We will post information and scheduling the new Track Committee meetings.

Again, it's an exciting time for our region. You can be a part of it as being a participant or as an important team member to host these events.—Thank you, Armando Manzo
