#### Here we go again!



#### Three's Company

I had forgotten just how much having three (or more) heats changes an event. It adds a social element to the events. It means that everyone has an off heat. Meaning they can have extra time to sort their car, grab a bite to eat, ride with friends or just hang out study the course and shoot the breeze with

fellow participants and spectators. You might ask yourself why we don't do three heats more often and it comes down to a matter of numbers. I hope to see continued numbers that support three or more heats. The reality is when you account for the lost time of taking a lunch break, we can run more cars in the same amount of time when running three heats. Let's hope this trend continues.

#### What Happened?

Our region's drivers school was once again a sell out. Not only did it sell out, we had folks waiting to fill any vacated spots on site (and as it just so happened.. we had four no-shows and four people on site ready to fill those coveted spots).

We split our pool of students in two, with one group being led on a course walk before taking to their morning session while the other group got some course work instruction (in a more intimate and detailed way than is normally possible). They then reported to work the morning session. We rotated through this pattern and by the end of the day each student had two driving sessions with a different instructor and had driven at least 18 laps (and rode along for an additional six); That's about four events worth of seat time in one day for the cost of two events, with the added bonus of one on one instruction.. and lunch thrown in to boot!

The daytime test and tune did not have a lot of participants. Those who came out got their fill and they had simply stopped running by about 3:00; The course was still open to the drivers, but they had just all got their fill of seat time.

The nighttime test and tune did not initially sell out but we sold the last remaining spots to walk ups. We were able to go course hot just before dusk. We generally see people get their fill of seat time and head out before we shut down, maybe it was the perfect weather but we still had a line of cars at 10:00 pm when we shut down the staging lane. I think our drivers were able to get a dozen or so runs in so it was a great value for seat time.



Our points events continue to have strong attendance this year. Points Event #1 had 94 and Points Event #2 had 88 entries. This is especially impressive as some of our members were out in Lincoln, NE for Spring Nationals. Also we tend to have soft attendance after a night time event, and as my Aunt Millie used to say, "It's hard to sing with the birds in the morning if you're out hooting with the owls all night".

We had a slightly different site usage plan due in part to the demolition of the stadium and also to the divided nature of running the school and the test and tune in parallel (We did have an abundance of DNF's and penalties). I take the blame for this. After turning the bones of the night time course into a "real" course I neglected to think about the visual cues we typically add to make the course easier to read at speed. To those who had a hard time learning this course, I apologize. We were up and running in a timely fashion with enough entries to run three heats again, although that meant extra work for a lot of our folks who had already completed their required work assignments. I think it's a small price to pay for the overall ease three heats brings to an event.



Unfortunately, about halfway through our third heat lightning rolled in and we had to go into a lightning hold. At this time many who had only had three of their allotted runs simply left. We also lost a lot of workers. But we did have a handful of drivers and workers stick it out. Once the weather had cleared and we found we could drain a rather large pond that had appeared on course we were able to go hot once again. We delivered those who stayed their remaining three runs, and as we began clearing course the rain came back in but to a much lesser degree. We were still able to have the

trailer packed, awards handed out and heading off site before 4:00 pm.



Our new software again worked flawlessly throughout the day.. not just keeping time but also our live results. If you haven't seen our live results, I invite and encourage you to do so at our next event, simply head to our website and click on "Live results" and you will see an array of unaudited results as they happen. You can also see the post audit changes as they are made as well. While these aren't official until our post event audit ,you'll have nearly as much information as we do in the trailer.

## 2019 Novice Program

After an extremely successful first year, KYSCCA will is bringing back the Novice program for 2019 with the start of the official season @ NCM on 5-5-19!

Brand new autocrossers (or newer drivers that have not completed a full season previously) will be eligible to take part in this class.

Novice class drivers will be competing against other novice drivers in a PAX based point system. PAX is an index system designed to equalize participants running cars from different SCCA Solo classes. The PAX value is a multiplier used on the entrant's time, and then compared directly with other class competitors and their PAX multiplied time.

This class will have its own awards for each event and will have its own year-end points. Once a novice driver wins the novice class at a points event, they will no longer be eligible to receive individual event awards for the novice class **but are still eligible for regular class trophies.** 

Please note that even after you win a novice event trophy you are not kicked out of the class! You will still be competing and accumulating novice year end points.

When you arrive, please inform the trailer during registration that you are a novice driver. This will ensure you are placed in the correct class (and if you are a two-driver car this will help in trying to get you and your co-driver scheduled in the same heat). You will get special instruction as well as some swag for this new class.

The novice chiefs will meet and greet first-time drivers when they arrive. This allows a good opportunity to go over what to expect/the flow of the day, how to grid, safety and individual car tech and they can answer any questions. The novice chiefs are there to get your day started on the right foot. Your current 2019 Novice Chiefs are Zachary Yurt and Jacob Zimmerlee. Feel free at any time to approach either of them or message them on Facebook.

**Novice walk** – At the start of every event the novice chiefs will have a novice walk (open to all, even the pros) that will offer general direction on how to attack the course of the day and also offer opportunity for open questions.

**Personal course walk** – If you need additional instruction, have questions about a specific element or need additional navigation help one of the novice chiefs will walk the course with you after the novice walk.

**Worker instruction** – the chiefs will show you what constitutes as a +1 (or more), the criteria for DNF, how to use the radio to call in cones, what to do if you have the red flag and open floor for general questions.

When it is your turn to drive the novice chiefs will be available to offer both instruction and guidance; their only job is to help you go faster. When it comes time for you to pull to the line, don't worry. We've got you!

**Coached runs** – Have an instructor ride with you and offer feedback both during and after your run

**Instructor runs** – Have an instructor drive your car once during your heat with you observing. This is specifically helpful if you are having issues navigating the course or need help negotiating a particular course element

**Ride Alongs** – (If run/work permissible) hop in the passenger seat with an instructor or another experienced driver if you are having issues navigating the course

At the end of the day, during the recap and awards, the Novice class will have its own trophy session. After the awards, the novice chiefs will hold a post-event Q&A session.
